#### A REMARKABLE JOURNEY AND MINISTRY!

While this month is the time in the church year when we look forward to the coming of Lord Jesus Christ at Christmas and His eventual Return, this year's holiday season is extra significant. Fr. Richard Molison will be retiring from active ordained ministry on December 31, 2017. We will be celebrating his wonderful ministry among us and the greater church at a <u>10 AM service of Holy Eucharist on Sunday</u> <u>January 7, 2018</u>. There will be NO 9:15 or 11 AM services that Sunday. A sit-down dinner at Noon will follow in his honor. ALL ARE WELCOME!!!



Many of you have known Fr. Molison and his wife, Barbara for many years. They have been an integral part of the heart and soul of our parish family since 1962! Upon arriving at St. Bartholomew's, Fr. Molison and Barbara not only raised their three children, Krista, Karen, and Stephen in the church, but they became actively involved in our church's ministry and mission. Both served together as co-superintendants for our Sunday School. With his experience as a school teacher in the City of Tonawa-da School District, Fr. Molison has always had a heart for instilling the truths of the Gospel in the lives of our children. As a layman, he taught confirmation class, trained our acolytes and lay readers, conducted Lenten Bible Study programs, and served on the Vestry and as Warden. He also developed the parish visitation ministry in the 1970s. Sensing God's call for further involvement, Fr. Molison pursued ordained ministry and in 1981, was ordained a deacon. *Continued on page 2*

As a deacon he played a pivotal role in supporting the ministry of our first rector, Fr. Russell Amend. In fact, reflecting on Fr. Molison's diaconal ministry, Fr. Amend said, "Richard always reflected the warmth of the Holy Spirit towards others. He was reliable and always prepared. He was a rock for our parish."

Sensing a call to the priesthood, Fr. Molison worked toward that goal and saw it granted by God's grace when he was ordained priest in 1996. That year was a year of mixed emotions as he and Barbara left St. Batholomew's for the first time so that he could serve as assisting priest at Advent Episcopal Church in Kenmore. In 1998, he received the call to serve as Rector of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Niagara Falls where he took a broken and struggling parish to a place of wholeness and self-sufficiency. When in 2003, the Episcopal Church turned its back on God's Word and 2000 years of Church Teaching concerning Holy Marriage, Fr. Molison and the Vestry of St. Stephen's joined St. Bartholomew's and three other Episcopal parishes to defend the Faith and chart a course forward for those who in the Episcopal Church desired to remain faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ and His Word. While he was unable to lead St. Stephen's out of the Episcopal Church due to his retirement in 2005, he provided them the foundation for how to remain faithful to the Lord.

After retiring from full-time ministry in 2006, Fr. Molison and Barbara returned to St. Bartholomew's. Since that time, they have continued to be active in the life and ministry of the church. We have been blessed by Barbara's involvement in the creation and maintenance of our library, in our monthly family movie nights, and her work with the Altar Guild and the Wednesday morning women's Bible Study. Fr. Molison has not only supported Fr. Ward in parish ministry by visiting and bringing communion to our sick and shut-ins, preaching, overseeing the lay eucharistic ministry, and until last year the kitchen ministry, he has also been instrumental in organizing and leading our travel club and the many special trips they have taken to the Site and Sound Theater in Lancaster, PA and the Creation Museum in KY, not to mention other local trips. Finally, during the last three years, Fr. Molison has worked with our Core Team as we have sought to develop a strategy and plan to impact our community with the Gospel. All in all, his has been a truly remarkable and blessed spiritual journey and ministry. We have been blessed by his and his wife's presence among us. Their active ministry will be missed but thanks be to God, they aren't going anywhere! They plan to remain with us for the foreseeable future, but in a less active role so they can enjoy some travel and time with the familv.

## The Twelve Days of Christmas

One English Christmas carol well-known world wide today is, however, more than a repetitious tune with pretty phrases and strange gifts. "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is a song with different levels of meaning. From 1558 to 1829, the Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. During this period, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written in England as a catechism song for young Catholics. The hidden meanings of the song's gifts were intended to help the children remember lessons of their faith. Instead of referring to an earthly suitor, the 'true love' mentioned in the song refers to God himself. The 'me' who receives the presents is symbolic of every baptized Christian. The 'partridge in a pear tree' is Jesus Christ.

The meaning of the other symbols are:

Two turtle doves: the Old and New Testaments

Three French hens: Faith, Hope and Love

Four calling birds: the four Gospels

Five golden rings: the first five books of the Old Testament

Six geese a-laying: the six days of creation

Seven swans a-swimming: seven gifts of the Holy Spirit

Eight maids a-milking: the eight Beatitudes

Nine ladies dancing: nine fruits of the Holy Spirit

Ten lords a-leaping: the Ten Commandments

Eleven pipers piping: the eleven faithful disciples

Twelve drummers drumming: the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.
