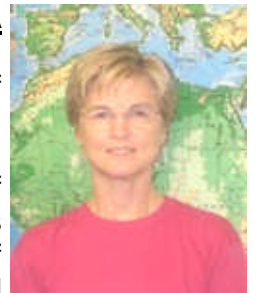
## **THE WINDOWS ARE IN - AND THEY ARE AWESOME -- THANKS BE TO GOD!**

## **MISSIONARY TO UGANDA VISITS ST. BARTHOLOMEW'S**

Susan Morris, of Jacksonville, Florida, visited St. Bart's on Sunday, December 13. Susan, a representative of SOMA, (Sharing of Ministries Abroad) and SAMS (Society of Anglican Missionaries and Senders) will be headed to Kampala, Uganda, in May of 2010, and will stay there for at least three years.



Susan will be serving in the *Office International Relations* for the Church of Uganda, and will be facing many challenges that are not found living in the USA. Until she moves to Uganda, she will be visiting churches throughout the United States to raise prayer and financial support, as well as getting the word out of the need for relationships across borders with our African brothers and sisters in the Anglican Communion.
